Towards developing a Climate Resilient Panaji



A shared learning dialogue, as part of the Rockefeller Foundation supported Asian Cities Climate Change Resilience Network (ACCCRN), was recently held in Panaji city which aimed at discussing the sectors identified to be impacted by climate change. The City Corporation of Panaji is applying the ICLEI ACCCRN Process (IAP), a toolkit developed by ICLEI's South Asia and Oceania offices specifically for city governments to help them assess their vulnerabilities to climate change and to develop corresponding climate resilience strategies.

Located in the south-eastern region of Indian state of Maharashtra, Solapur, also known as "The City of Martyrs" is now an ICLEI member. Solapur is also one of the 4 cities, across Rajasthan and Maharashtra, in which the European Commission funded project on Adopting Integrated Urban Water Management in Indian cities (AdoptIUWM) for capacity building and undertaking water sector reforms is being implemented since 2013. ICLEI South Asia is currently working towards implementation of 2 pilot projects to demonstrate the principles of Integrated Urban Water Management in Solapur city.
